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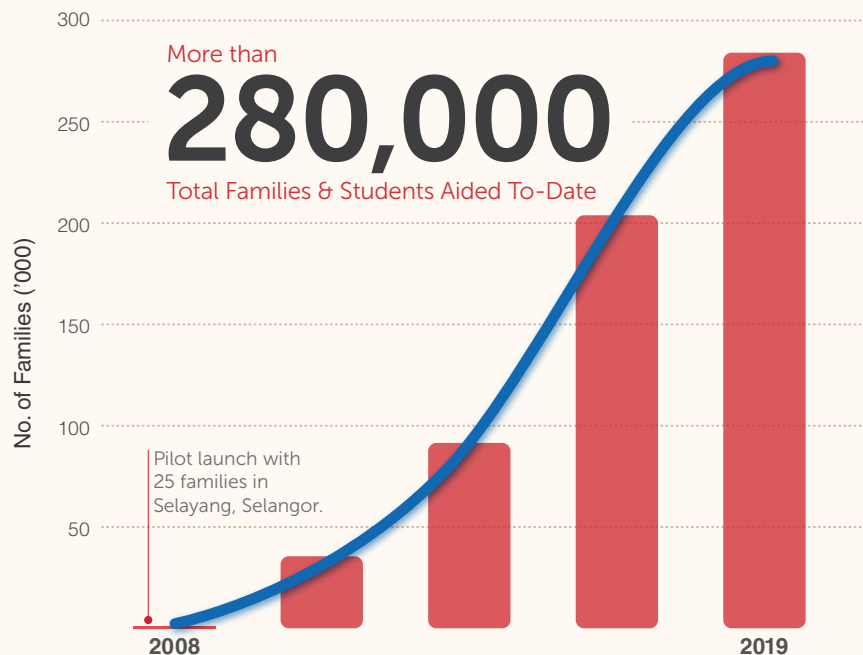
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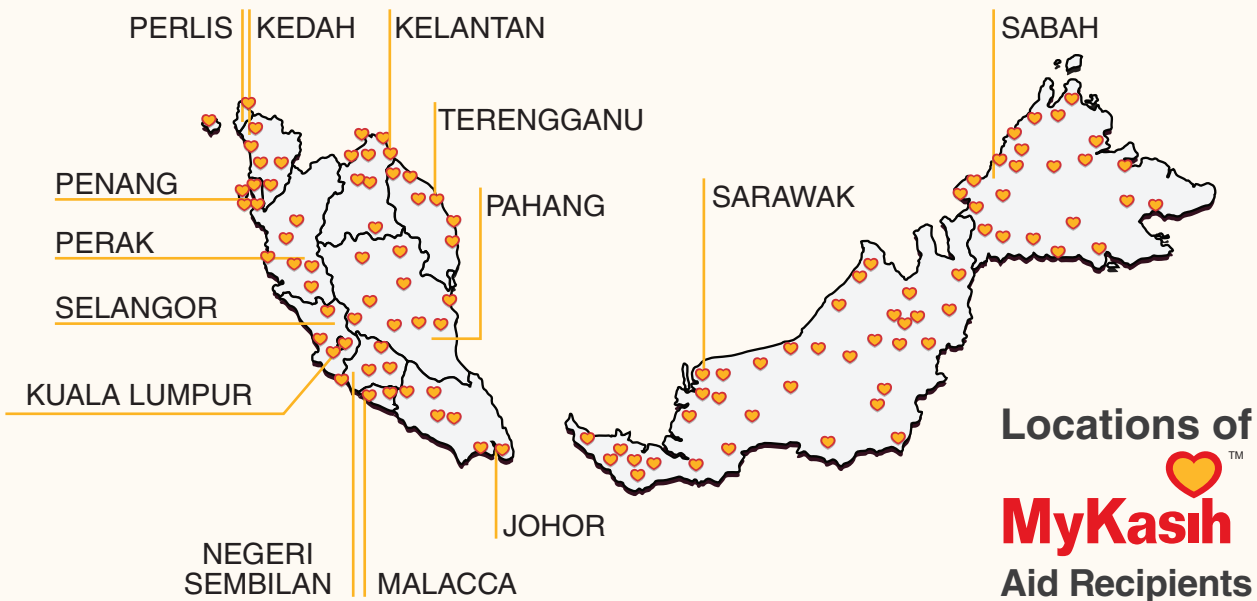
MyKasih Today

MyKasih started with a pilot MyKasih 'Love My Neighbourhood' food aid project involving 25 families back in December 2008. To-date, we have channeled **RM 260 million** via the MyKasih cashless payment system to more than **280,000 families** in over 400 locations nationwide, out of which, 20,000 are primary and secondary student beneficiaries aided through the MyKasih 'Love My School' bursary scheme.



The scope of the MyKasih system has expanded beyond food aid and student bursaries to include cashless payments for public transportation, fuel, medical treatments and utility bills. Essentially, the MyKad account becomes the single main account to which low-income households can use to access multiple welfare products or services.

The Ministry of Urban Wellbeing, Housing and Local Government, Johor and Sarawak State Governments, Lembaga Zakat Selangor, Zakat Pulau Pinang and Majlis Agama Islam Melaka, have also been using the innovative MyKasih system for their respective welfare programmes for the underprivileged.



CHAIRMAN'S MESSAGE



Dear Friends,

The first half of 2019 saw us preoccupied with extending the Love My School student bursary programme in more than 90 schools nationwide. A total of 8,000 primary and secondary school students are receiving cashless bursaries for their daily needs in school, thanks to donors who continue to support them throughout their academic journey.

Ever since we started the 'Love My School' bursary programme in 2012, students' attendance and academic performance have steadily improved because they are assured of their daily meals and learning necessities in school and can therefore participate fully in class.

Our collaboration with the East Coast Economic Region Development Council (ECERDC) started in 2017 and continues today in 18 primary Orang Asli schools in Pahang, Kelantan and Terengganu. We have spent RM 6 million to provide all 3,800 Asli students with cashless bursaries. The allocation also covers the setting up of computer labs and internet connectivity, supporting their annual school sports day events and UPSR study camps, as well as educational exposure trips. The outcomes of these programmes have been positive! Attendance has improved from 50% to 90% and academic performance have shown marked improvement.

Our efforts for the Orang Asli have transcended beyond school boundaries and into their communities. Five community learning centres in Gerik, Perak, and Raub, Pahang, continue to be supported by HSBC Bank Malaysia, Linaco Group, as well as individual well-wishers. Children receive after-school

tutorials and meals while their parents work on community edible gardens and participate in skills training (financial literacy, electrical wiring, computer skills and handicrafts) and income-generation projects (chicken and vegetable/fruit farming) to achieve food and financial security.

In this issue, we report on the Caltex Fuel Your School campaign which we successfully completed with Chevron Malaysia for the seventh consecutive year, this time, in Selangor and Kuala Lumpur. Eight schools received STEM learning materials worth RM 170,000 based on classroom projects proposals they had submitted.

On 28 April, a charity golf event was held in Kuching in aid of the Sarawak Rural Kids Education Fund. An impressive sum of RM 1.08 million was raised, which will support more than 1,000 students with cashless bursaries and Back-To-School items through the Love My School programme. I would like to express my deepest gratitude to Kelab Golf Sarawak, Sarawak Energy Berhad, and the 44 corporate and individual donors who had contributed in cash and in-kind towards this cause. They are duly acknowledged in this issue of MyKasihNews.

This issue also covers the outcomes of three entrepreneurship training programme conducted for Yayasan PETRONAS, Mah Sing Foundation and JTI Malaysia. We look forward to the second phase of the training where participants will be mentored as they bring their businesses to market. We are extremely proud of their achievements so far and appreciate our donors' continued support in seeing them through.



Before I end, I would like to thank The Store Group, JTI Malaysia, the Federation of Malaysian Manufacturers, and Sri Nona Food Industries, for partnering with us for their fundraising campaigns this year.

I hope you will enjoy reading this issue of MyKasihNews where we have highlighted programmes and activities that have made a positive difference to our beneficiaries, especially the children in vulnerable communities like the Orang Asli.

We hope you will be inspired to act on the spirit of kindness and will join us in meaningfully impacting the communities we serve.

About

MyKasih



Established in **2009**, MyKasih Foundation is a charity organisation founded by DIALOG's Executive Chairman Tan Sri Dr Ngau Boon Keat and his wife Puan Sri Jean Ngau, to help low-income families through food aid and education regardless of race, religion or descent.

MyKasih not only aims to improve nutrition through its food aid programme but also strives to transform the families through skills training and education, especially for their children, to break the poverty cycle and give them hope for a better future.

What is significant is that MyKasih uses leading-edge

technology to support its aid distribution. The MyKasih 'Love My Neighbourhood' food aid programme and the MyKasih 'Love My School' student bursary scheme run on an efficient cashless payment system developed by DIV Services Sdn Bhd, a subsidiary of DIALOG Group Berhad.

All disbursements and payments are effected through the use of the Mykad, which is the chip-based ID card issued to all Malaysians. Use of the Mykad allows us to target aid to the right person, enabling us to distribute aid in an efficient, transparent and secure way. This feature is probably the first of its kind in welfare distribution in the world.

OUR FOOD AID PROGRAMME...

The MyKasih 'Love My Neighbourhood' is a cashless food aid programme which reaches out to families earning a combined monthly household income of RM 1,500 and below. Recipients receive a monthly allowance of RM 80 through their MyKad account, which can be spent on approved essential items at partner retail outlets.

The approved food items range from ten different product categories such as rice, noodles, bread, biscuits, eggs, seasoning, flour, cooking oil, canned food and beverages. The list of approved items can be expanded to include basic household appliances and schooling necessities for post-disaster relief.



OUR STUDENT BURSARY PROGRAMME...

Under the MyKasih 'Love My School' bursary programme, students from economically-challenged backgrounds are given annual bursaries via a smartcard linked to their MyKad account, to pay for meals at the school canteen and to purchase school books and stationeries from the school bookshop.

Additional support is rendered through sponsorship of extra tuition classes, study camps, English literacy and numeracy workshops, and computer labs for 21st century learning. Educational exposure trips, edible garden projects and sports activities are also funded to enhance their learning experience in school.



OUR ORANG ASLI CHILDREN'S EDUCATION FUND...

School drop-outs are most rampant amongst the Orang Asli, and the single, greatest contributing factor to the dropout is poverty. The 'Orang Asli Children's Education Fund' was set up to support indigenous children in national schools and those attending after-school classes at community learning centers.

In catering to the unique needs of the community, the fund ensures that Orang Asli children, especially those in rural areas, are not left behind and are able to attain an education and an opportunity to develop to their fullest potential.



OUR SUPPLEMENTARY ASSISTANCE PROGRAMMES...

In our effort to help our beneficiaries break out of the poverty cycle, we work with accredited training partners to provide skills and entrepreneurship training to empower them with knowledge and skills to realise their full potential and achieve financial independence.

Additionally, health awareness programmes and screenings are done in collaboration with the Ministry of Health and the National Population and Family Development Board (locally known as 'LPPKN') to support the holistic well-being of our beneficiaries.



HOW YOU CAN HELP..

We rely on funding from donors to carry out all of the above community and school programmes. Companies are welcome to adopt MyKasih's programmes and brand them accordingly as part of their on-going corporate social responsibility initiatives.



Every ringgit goes a long way in making a difference. All cash donations to MyKasih Foundation are **tax-exempted** and are **passed in full** to the beneficiaries.

MyKasih will oversee the expenditure and disbursements to ensure that funds are used strictly for their intended purposes. Donors will receive fund utilisation reports detailing the purchasing trends, progress of projects undertaken, as well as impacts and outcomes of investments made.

DIALOG does community work in MyKasih schools



Through the Group's Employee Volunteer Programme, DIALOG employees actively participate in MyKasih Foundation's programmes and activities throughout the year.

DIALOG Staff Volunteerism

On 3 February, an 83-strong delegation of volunteers representing DIALOG's senior management team from six countries pitched in to help revamp Sekolah Kebangsaan Sungai Dua (Asli) in Bentong, Pahang. Led by the Chief Executive Officer, Mustafa Kamal, the Group's teambuilding and community activity saw the volunteers spending half the day redecorating classrooms, organising the school library, replanting the school's edible garden, painting of the school's entrance, classrooms, gazebo and the boarding school's prep room.

DIALOG also spent an additional RM 30,000 to repair SK Sungai Dua's perimeter fencing and build a side access gate.

On 11 and 16 June 2019, a total of 120 staff carried out community work in SJKC Yok Poon, a primary school in Pengerang. Staff devoted their time and energy landscaping the school's garden and cleaning classrooms, carrying out minor repair works, and painting walls and floors to give the school a fresh look and feel.

This year, DIALOG allocated RM 37,000 for the Lanjan Tigers to host the Selangor under-12 rugby tournament, to organise a one-week rugby clinic for 11 Orang Asli schools in Selangor, and to fund the Lanjan Tigers' participation in 12 tournaments throughout the year.

The Lanjan Tigers have been actively participating in various district and state-level rugby tournaments and have achieved commendable placings, having emerged as champions in some categories. One Lanjan Tiger has been selected to represent Selangor by the State Selection Committee. The steady progress and achievements of Lanjan Tigers have been noticed by the Malaysian Minister of Education, who met with the Lanjan Tigers in Putrajaya on 19 September 2018.

Two MyKasih-supported Orang Asli primary schools, SK Bukit Lanjan (Asli) Damansara Perdana in Selangor and SK Sungai Rual (Asli) in Jeli, Kelantan, met for the first time on 28 June 2019. The trip was organised by the East Coast Economic Region Development Council (ECERDC) to benchmark SK Sungai Rual against SK Bukit Lanjan, in the areas of academic and sporting excellence.

Both SK Bukit Lanjan and SK Sungai Rual are Orang Asli primary schools adopted by DIALOG Group. The latter came on board the *empower* ECER-MyKasih academic programme in 2018, a collaboration between ECERDC and MyKasih Foundation aimed at improving the academic outcomes of Orang Asli students in the east coast region.

In addition to supporting the entire student population with cashless bursaries, DIALOG has also equipped both schools with computer labs and ICT infrastructure, as well as funded their study camps and sports events.

After completing the benchmarking meeting at SK Bukit Lanjan, the 80 students of SK Sungai Rual had an opportunity to experience KidZania, a fun edutainment centre located nearby.

Their outing was followed by a movie, dinner, and trivia games at DIALOG Tower, located just a short walking distance from KidZania.

The students, their chaperone teachers, and the representatives from ECERDC had a long and productive day that day and we look forward to seeing the progress in these two schools arising from their shared learnings.

Langsat Terminals focus CSR efforts in schools

In line with DIALOG Group's policy to support more children in schools through the MyKasih 'Love My School' student bursary programme, DIALOG's subsidiaries, Langsat Terminal (One) Sdn Bhd and Langsat Terminal (Two) Sdn Bhd (collectively known as 'Langsat Terminals'), adopted Sekolah Kebangsaan Tanjung Langsat and Sekolah Kebangsaan Perigi Aceh.

The two schools, both located in Tanjung Langsat, Johor, started the 'Love My School' programme on 10 February 2019 with 76 student beneficiaries.

Langsat Terminals also committed funding for the refurbishment of the schools' computer labs, to support academic or sports related school activities, and also invest in personal protective equipment for the students and teachers. The latter is a response to the Johor state government's request that the private sector team up with public health officials to mitigate health risks from Pasir Gudang Sungai Kim Kim's toxic pollution.

Langsat Terminals has been a long-time supporter of the MyKasih Foundation, having sponsored families in Pasir Gudang under the 'Love My Neighbourhood' food aid programme since 2010. This year, Langsat Terminals has opted to channel their CSR efforts

towards helping underprivileged children in schools for long-term engagement with the community through education. Other schools in Pasir Gudang which DIALOG has adopted are SK Bandar Seri Alam 2 (60 students) and SJKT Masai (50 students).

Echoing DIALOG Group's CSR Policy to channel more resources towards children education, DIALOG's joint venture company, Pengerang Independent Terminals Sdn Bhd (PITSB), kicked off the MyKasih 'Love My School' cashless bursary programme in February for 50 secondary students in Sekolah Menengah Kebangsaan (SMK) Tanjung Datuk in Pengerang, Johor.

SMK Tanjung Datuk was later renamed SMK Pengerang Utama when it successfully relocated to Taman Bayu Damai and became fully operational in June 2019.

PITSB, which provides tank terminal storage facilities and handling services in Pengerang, has to-date contributed more than RM 2 million to MyKasih Foundation since March 2013 to aid low-income households in Pengerang through the 'Love My Neighbourhood' food aid programme.

PITSB plans to regularly engage with the students and explore areas of opportunity to help the students achieve their fullest potential.

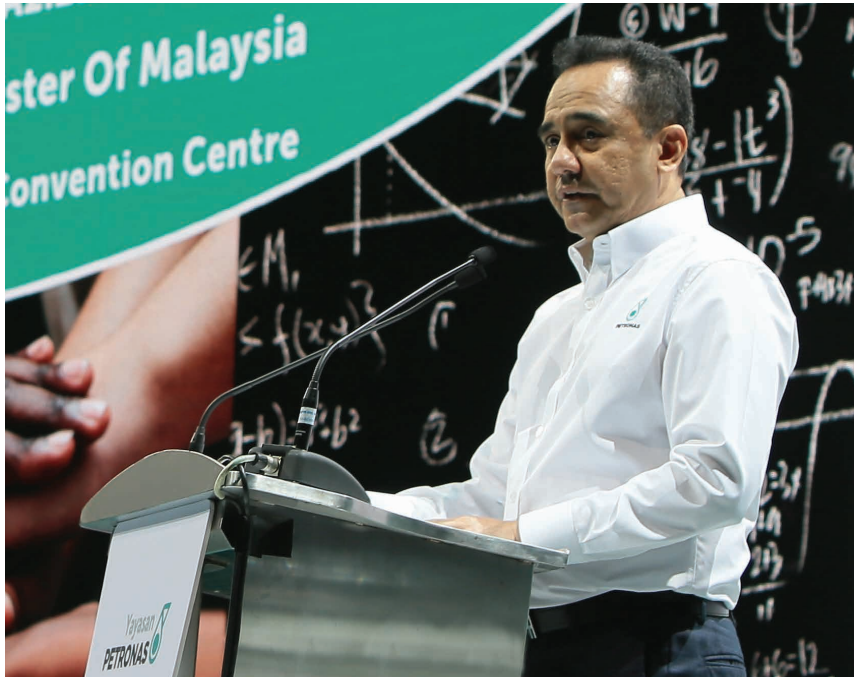

In conjunction with the opening launch of Yayasan PETRONAS on 1 March 2019 in Kuala Lumpur, two women from Kuala Nerus, Terengganu, had an experience of a lifetime showcasing their cottage businesses to the Deputy Prime Minister of Malaysia, Dato' Seri Dr Wan Azizah binti Wan Ismail.

Between August and December 2018, 100 participants from the Kuala Nerus fishing community of Terengganu completed an empowerment and entrepreneurship income-generation programme under the #KitaCipta Planting Tomorrow programme in collaboration with MyKasih Foundation.

By April 2019, the participants had achieved an income generation of 80 percent more than the income target they had set at the beginning of the programme.



We would like to congratulate PETRONAS on the setting up of Yayasan PETRONAS. Faridah Ibrahim, an icon of the Kuala Nerus #KitaCipta programme, is famous for her delicious Nasi Khaumok (a Thai version of the Nasi Beryani) that she makes with her daughter-in-law. The #KitaCipta entrepreneurship programme taught her to expand her business using social media and to venture into catering and delivery services. As a result, her sales boomed. Faridah's Nasi Khaumok production increased from 2kg to 10kg daily.

35-year old Che Noorfaezah Mat Nasir was earning RM100 a month doing odd jobs like cleaning and cooking at neighbours houses. She struggled to care for her seven children and was determined to make a decent living. She realised that she had a talent for traditional massages and was encouraged by her #KitaCipta programme coaches and peers to set it up as a business.

Faezah started by creating a business card and promoting her business on social media. She expanded her massage services to include caring for mothers in confinement and began retailing her own homemade massage oils. Her monthly earnings increased from RM 100 to RM 2700!

"The first thing I did when I started earning more money was to pay my debts. My debtors were shocked that I was able to pay. They have been so kind to me. My husband has been ever so supportive and helps send me to my customers' houses. Thank you, PETRONAS and MyKasih, for giving me the opportunity to discover myself and my ability to be successful!"

In addition to the significant increase in income, the programme imparted a life-transforming mind-set change, i.e. from a situation of lack, to a more positive condition of resourcefulness and creativity to seize opportunities. The programme also equipped the participants with the skills to weather any challenges they might face as they went about establishing their cottage businesses.

Yayasan Petronas and MyKasih Foundation will be working together on the second phase of the programme, which will see the same batch of entrepreneurs coached to expand their businesses into a larger market.

JTI Malaysia continues support for six years running

Food Aid Programme

JTI Malaysia's support of MyKasih's food aid continue for the sixth consecutive year. where JTI is currently supporting 300 families in six states, namely Johor (Pagoh), Selangor (Carey Island), Penang (Permatang Pauh), Pahang (Bentong), Perak (Gerik) as well as Sabah (Tawau).

Travelling half-an-hour through an oil palm estate to get to the nearest paved road, 38 Mah Meri Orang Asli families from Kampung Sungai Kurau and 12 families from Kampung Bakar Leleh in Selangor did their first cashless shopping under the 'Love My Neighbourhood' food aid programme at Tesco Jenjarum on 22 February 2019.

The chosen food aid beneficiaries, who hail from B40 households earning a combined income below RM 1,500 per month, are receiving a monthly allowance of RM 80 through their MyKad account which can be spent on approved essential food items at participating neighbourhood retail outlets.

Sarawak Charity Golf



In aid of the Sarawak Rural Kids Education Fund

The Sarawak Charity Golf 2019 fund-raiser was held as a follow up to the inaugural Samarahan Charity Golf Tournament in 2017. The 2017 campaign had raised RM 1,025,000 which supported 1,041 underprivileged students in 16 rural schools with cashless bursaries and Back-To-school items between the period of August 2017 and December 2018.

On 28 April 2019, the Sarawak Charity Golf 2019 raised RM 1,080,000 from 44 corporate and individual donors, the proceeds of which will aid underprivileged students through the Sarawak Rural Kids Education Fund.

The golf event was carried out in collaboration with Kelab Golf Sarawak as venue host, Sarawak Energy Berhad as the tournament directorate and MyKasih Foundation as the charity beneficiary.

The first media event was held in Kuching on 27 January 2019 to kick-off the fund-raising campaign. A second cheque presentation ceremony was hosted by The Star Foundation at Menara Star, Petaling Jaya, on 18 April to further promote the campaign in the lead up to the tournament on 28 April.

Next steps would be for schools and student beneficiaries to be identified for this programme. Upon selection of the beneficiary schools and registration of the students receiving the aid, proceeds from the Sarawak Charity Golf 2019 event will be disbursed to targeted student beneficiaries through the MyKasih 'Love My School' cashless bursary scheme.

Each eligible student beneficiary (i.e. students who hail from households earning a combined household income of RM 1,500 and below) will receive a monthly allowance worth RM60 via their student smartcard. They can use the allowance to purchase daily meals at their school canteen, as well as books, stationeries and other learning necessities from their school bookshop.

48 students of Sekolah Kebangsaan (SK) Sungai Pelong in Sungai Buloh, Kuala Lumpur, had a joyous start to the school term with the launch of the Mah Sing Foundation School+ programme on 15 January 2019.

MSF School+ programme is a holistic programme for underprivileged students aimed at enhancing their access to education, health and safety.

Community+ Programme @ Sungai Buloh, Selangor.

On 13 April 2019, 24 participants graduated from a four-month 'Mengecapi Aspirasi Diri' empowerment and entrepreneurship programme which they had embarked on in December 2018 under Mah Sing Foundation's Community+ programme.

MSF Community+ is a programme that aims to empower underprivileged families through food aid and training. MSF Community+ uses MyKasih cashless distribution platform to deliver food aid to its 100 recipient families.

Both MSF School+ and MSF Community+ are long-term support programmes and are intended to positively impact the lives of students and the communities they live in. The graduation ceremony was a very emotional event for the participants and their coaches, as four participants shared their experience, challenges, learnings and breakthroughs.

One participant, Noorzanawati, dreamed of opening a bakery someday with her refined baking skills and newly-gained marketing knowledge. Her husband, Thamrin, who is a qualified and licensed crane operator but previously unsuccessful in securing job contracts, finally broke through after applying knowledge from the programme and received a decent payment for a two-week job stint he delivered on.

Ambiga learned how to make a business out of selling groceries to the community, while others learnt how to package and market their cookies and snacks.

Most importantly, family members of the empowered participants rallied to support them on their entrepreneurial journey. They helped each other, motivated one another, and most importantly, believed in each other.

The group had earlier pledged to generate a collective income of RM15,250 within the four-month programme. The actual results yielded a total of RM19,561!

Mah Sing Foundation and MyKasih Foundation are extremely proud of the graduates and we look forward to hearing about their progressive success in the months and years to come.



LINACO supports rural Orang Asli learning centers



Staff of Linaco Group had an eye-opening visit to Sekolah Kebangsaan Pos Balar in Gua Musang, Kelantan, on 25-26 June 2018. During the trip, they witnessed the Temiar Orang Asli children travelling for hours on the back of a truck to get to school. The village of Pos Balar also does not have electricity nor a clinic with a full-time medical staff.

After seeing the hardship and challenges first-hand, they increased their support for Orang Asli community learning centers and schools. Linaco currently supports 165 students in three primary schools via the Love My School cashless bursary programme, which are SK Sungai Bumbun (Asli) in Selangor, and SK Pos Balar (Asli) and SK Sri Melur in Kelantan.

This year, Linaco adopted two Orang Asli community learning centers in Gerik, Perak, namely Kampung Ong Jangking and Kampung Leyef. Their funding support covers the centers' operational costs, which include food, learning materials and teachers' allowances.

Health Carnival with LINACO

Concerned about increasing reports on Orang Asli child mortality rates in rural areas, Linaco sponsored a health carnival in Pusat Didikan Kampung (PDK) Cenwaey Penaney, Kampung Tual, Pahang on 23 June 2019.

The health carnival featured a talk on the "Prevention of Child Sexual Abuse" which was attended by leaders from Kampung Tual, neighbouring villages, as well as teachers from the learning centers in Gerik.

During the carnival, basic medical supplies were given to five learning centers and three communities to treat mild ailments such as headaches, fever, cough, sore throat, food poisoning and scratch wounds.

Conducted by SOLS 24/7, the 3-hour talk explained the rights of children, the definition, types and characteristics of child sexual abuse and the importance of teaching children personal safety.

This is in line with The Women, Family and Community Ministry's recently launched campaign on sex education for children.

Education transformation for Indigenous Children



Bateq and Semaq Beri Orang Asli students of Sekolah Kebangsaan Kuala Tahan, Pahang

On 28 January 2019, Ministry of Education launched the MyKasih 'Love My School' programme for a special group of students, the Bateq Orang Asli, who study at Sekolah Kebangsaan (SK) Kuala Tahan, in Jerantut, Pahang.

This is in line with the Ministry's initiative on education for indigenous children (known as Initiative #57 of the Malaysian Education Blueprint 2013-2025: *Transformasi Pendidikan Orang Asli dan Peribumi*).

Travelling to school daily by boat, the semi-nomadic Bateq Orang Asli are participants of an initiative called 'Chup Badui Sikulah', which means 'Let's go to school' in Bateq language. The initiative aims to encourage the Bateq Orang Asli children to attend school consistently so that their academic journey can progress unhindered.

The bursary support was not only meant to benefit 43 Bateq Orang Asli students of SK Kuala Tahan but also 49 Semaq Beri Orang Asli students studying in the same school. As beneficiaries, the students would receive a monthly allowance of RM60 via their smartcard to spend on daily nourishment and classroom study materials to encourage them to participate fully in school.

MOE hopes that following proven successes of the MyKasih bursary programme in other schools, the school attendance and academic results of the Orang Asli students of SK Kuala Tahan would improve.

Dusun Bonggi students of Sekolah Kebangsaan Sabur in Pulau Banggi, Sabah

On 22 April 2019, MOE launched the 'Love My School' programme in Sekolah Kebangsaan (SK) Sabur in Pulau Banggi, Kudat, Sabah.

140 students of the Dusun Bonggi ethnic group received their MyKasih student smartcards, and at the same time, 40 units of SunKing Pro 300 solar lights were presented to the school and to 37 families of Kampung Sabur.

The school was chosen for intervention due to the dire state of the impoverished community and the school in general. Homes in Kampung Sabur are without piped water and electricity, which makes it an uncondusive condition for living, let alone for studying. The school, still standing on its old wooden foundation, relies on groundwater supplied from a well, which runs dry during drought.

Despite the tough conditions, teachers are extremely passionate about educating the children, to the extent that they built their own teachers' living quarters within the community to be close to the school.

Due to distance and costly transportation services, parents from neighbouring villages have resorted to setting up a few transit homes in Kampung Sabur to ensure that their children attend school every day.

While attempting to address the larger matters at hand, MOE hopes that with the aid from MyKasih, the students will be able to study comfortably at school and back home.

Residing in Dengkil, Selangor, the students are from Kampung Bukit Tampoi, a Temuan Orang Asli village surrounded by oil palm plantations and industries.

The Thorntons have been an avid supporter of MyKasih Foundation since 2011. Over the years, they have supported various education programmes for Orang Asli children in rural communities in Raub, Pahang, and have also supported families and students in Segambut (Kuala Lumpur), Sungai Udang (Melaka) and Hulu Langat (Selangor) with food aid.

This year, not only have they assisted 50 Orang Asli students of SK Bukit Tampoi with cashless bursaries, the Thorntons have also sponsored the refurbishment of the school's computer lab, benefiting all the students in the school.

An insight into the good work of Rotary

Yayasan Pasir Gudang continues to run Smart Food programme

On April 20, Yayasan Pasir Gudang (YPG) kicked off the 2019 'Smart Food' cashless food aid programme for 120 families at Mydin Taman Rinting in Pasir Gudang, Johor. The event was officiated by Johor Women Development and Tourism Committee Chairman, YB Liow Cai Tung.

Last year, 245 families with household earnings of RM 350 per capita and below received RM 80 every month via their MyKad account to shop for basic provisions at designated outlets such as Redmart, Eonsave, and IMCOOP.

Caltex Fuel Your School 2018 Campaign concludes

The Caltex Fuel Your School (FYS) 2018 campaign concluded in Selangor and Kuala Lumpur earlier this year, delivering inspiring classroom sessions for students to further promote the learning of STEM subjects.

In its seventh year of collaboration with MyKasih Foundation, Chevron Malaysia Limited, which carries the retail brand Caltex®, funded 20 classroom projects in eight MyKasih-supported schools in Kuala Lumpur and Selangor amounting to RM 170,000.

SJK (T) Thamboosamy Pillai in Sentul, Kuala Lumpur, won six projects with classroom materials worth RM 51,600, while SJK (T) Rawang won five projects worth RM43,000, respectively. Other winning schools included two primary Orang Asli schools – SK Bukit Lanjan and SK Sungai Judah, as well as SK Kampung Tunku, SK Sungai Pelong, and SK Taman Dato' Harun 1.

These eight winning schools are supported by MyKasih under the 'Love My School' programme, where students from low-income households receive cashless bursaries worth RM 720 per student per annum via their MyKasih smartcard to pay for meals at the school canteen and other schooling essentials at the school bookstore.

Balance funds of RM 57,000 from the Caltex FYS 2018 programme were channelled to three schools to support 115 underprivileged students with bursaries under the 'Love My School' programme.

Since its inception in Malaysia in 2012, the Caltex FYS programme has funded 304 classroom projects in 158 schools in eleven states and benefited close to 100,000 students collectively.

Caltex FYS is part of Chevron's global "Energy for Learning Initiative" which partners with local communities, governments and non-profit groups to expand learning opportunities and support the social and economic development of these communities. Globally, FYS has made a positive impact in the U.S., Canada, New Zealand, Singapore, Thailand and Philippines.

Intern sharing...

Between March and June 2019, 17 year old Izzat Thaqif did an internship with MyKasih Foundation where he was given the opportunity to have hands-on experience in dealing with programme beneficiaries. Here he shares his experience in those few months with MyKasih.

My most memorable experience in MyKasih...

Among many experiences that have challenged me, humbled me, and inspired me, my most memorable experience during my time at MyKasih was the Mah Sing Community+ home visits of beneficiaries. The task was simple in theory but exceedingly tedious in reality.

We went to the houses of new MyKasih food-aid applicants to gather and record information on their overall state of living. We heard tales of family members dying of cancer or suffering from chronic diseases and witnessed with our own eyes the lack of basic hygiene in some homes.

What really got to me was the sheer inequality of it all. I was astounded to discover that there were people who still lived in such poverty in such close vicinity to a (mainly) affluent part of Damansara.

My greatest learning during the internship...

Never take anything for granted. I know how cliché it sounds, but for me, the meaning of this simple phrase has changed throughout my time in MyKasih. Taking something for granted is expecting something to be there for you no matter what you do; be it the material things in life, your ability to breathe or, scarier still, your parents.

I also began to see that never taking anything for granted also meant that you have only one chance to live your life and to find a way to really enjoy it no matter what circumstances may try to stop you. I saw that people in the most difficult of situations have been able to find happiness. It's all about your perspective and the attitude that follows.

In my humble opinion, education is paramount in lifting communities out of poverty. We must also realise that we are the true drivers of the nation's economy and we have the power to end poverty. Regular citizens must play their part by taking an active role in charitable activities. I strongly believe that charity begins at home.
